PUBLIC SECTOR EQUALITY DUTY – GUIDANCE FOR MEMBERS

What is the duty?

In making decisions on the attached reports, Members are reminded of their legal duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010 to have due regard to the need to:-

- (i) eliminate discrimination, harassment and victimisation;
- (ii) advance equality of opportunity between those who share a protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- (iii) foster good relations between those who share a protected characteristic and persons who do not share it.

The “protected characteristics” under the legislation are: age; disability; gender reassignment; pregnancy and maternity; race; religion or belief; sex; sexual orientation; and (in relation to point (i) above only) marriage and civil partnership.

How can Members discharge the duty?

To ‘have due regard’ means that in making decisions, Members must consciously consider the need to do the three things set out above. This requires a conscious approach and state of mind. The duty must influence the final decision.

However, it is not a duty to achieve a particular result (e.g. to eliminate unlawful racial discrimination or to promote good relations between persons of different racial groups). It is a duty to have due regard to the need to achieve these goals.

How much regard is ‘due’ will depend upon the circumstances and in particular on the relevance of the needs to the decision in question. The greater the relevance and potential impact that a decision may have on people with protected characteristics, the higher the regard required by the duty.

What does this mean for Committee/Full Council decisions?

Members are directed to the section in reports headed ‘Equalities, Staffing and Financial Implications’. This will indicate whether or not an Equality Impact Assessment (EIA) has been carried out as part of the development of the proposals and, if so, what the outcome of that assessment is.

An EIA will be appended to a report where it is likely that the action recommended in the report could have a differential impact (either positive or negative) upon people from different protected groups. The report author will have assessed whether or not an EIA is required. If one is not required, the report author will explain why that is.

Where an EIA is provided, Members should consider its contents and take those into account when reaching their decision. Members should also be satisfied that the assessment is sufficiently robust and that they have enough of an understanding of the issues to be able to discharge their legal duty satisfactorily.

Councillor W Howatson, Provost of the Council, presided.

1. DECLARATION OF MEMBERS' INTERESTS

The Provost asked members if they had any interests to declare in terms of the Councillors' Code of Conduct. No interests were intimated.

3. MINUTE OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The Minute of Meeting of ACT2 (Aberdeenshire Charities Trust) of 9 March, 2017, had been circulated, was **approved** as a correct record, and thereafter signed by the Chair.

4. ACT2 (ABERDEENSHIRE CHARITIES TRUST) - ANNUAL UPDATE 2017/18

With reference to the Minute of Meeting of the Trust of 9 March, 2017 (Item 6) there had been circulated a report dated 29 August, 2018 by the Director of Business Services seeking Members views on how the trust funds had been accessed over the financial year 2017/18

under the previously adopted management plan and providing a breakdown of all applications received by Area Committees during that period, along with amounts awarded and a note of the charitable purpose under which they were awarded. The report (1) explained that there had been limited uptake, with two of the Area Committees receiving no applications over the relevant period, (2) advised that reports would be taken to all Area Committees to review whether the current minimum and maximum level of awards were appropriate, and also to review the split between revenue which can be spent, and capital that must remain in trust; and (3) proposed that officers continue work to publicise the availability of the trust for funding where appropriate, monitor the application process for a further 12 month period and that the management plan of ACT2 be reviewed thereafter.

The Trust **agreed**:

- (1) to note the ACT2 applications made to and determined by Area Committees in 2017/18 contained in Appendix 1 of the report;
- (2) that officers continue work to publicise the availability of the Trust for funding, where appropriate, and monitor the application process for a further 12 month period; and
- (3) that a further update on the operation of ACT2 be provided at the end of the financial year 2018/19.

REPORT TO ABERDEENSHIRE CHARITIES TRUST (ACT2) – 16 JANUARY 2020

ANNUAL UPDATE

1 Reason for Report / Summary

- 1.1 *The report provides an update to trustees on the applications made to the trust since the end of the financial year 2017/18 to September 2019. This timeframe is to ensure that trustees have the most up to date information.*

2 Recommendations

The Trustees are recommended to:

- 2.1 **Consider the ACT2 applications made to and determined by Area Committees in 2018/19 and to the end of September 2019, details of which are contained in Appendix 2.**
- 2.2 **Delegate any decision made to ACT2's fund for support for those wounded by war to the Business Services Committee of Aberdeenshire Council for approval**
- 2.3 **Request a further update on the operation of ACT2 as appropriate.**

3 Purpose and Decision Making Route

- 3.1 The Management Plan for ACT2 was approved on the 9th of March 2017. The first annual report was presented to the trust on the 27th September 2018. This report is the second annual report and members are asked to consider how the funds have been allocated during the reporting period.

4 Discussion

- 4.1 Applications to the Trust are determined by Area Committees to ensure local decision making and due to the structure of the trust. Appendix 1 to this report contains a breakdown of all applications received by the Area Committees during the reporting period along with the amounts awarded and a note of the charitable purpose for which the award was made.
- 4.2 As a reminder, in the 2017/2018 financial year, 6 awards were made from the trust totaling £4,386.03. Appendix 1 of this report shows the updated figures and shows that there have been 11 applications resulting in awards of £11,880 from the Trust. It is encouraging that more applications have been made and that the awards have more than doubled in the last financial year ensuring that the trust funds are being appropriately accessed by those in need.
- 4.3 It is disappointing that the number of applications is still relatively low however there is an increase in applications as well as queries regarding the available funding. Two areas did not receive any applications this year. Buchan has never

received an application however this is not unsurprising given the low available sum. Garioch did not receive any applications in the last reporting period.

- 4.4 Officers will continue to promote the availability of the trust where appropriate. This is done primarily through corporate communications and through Area Committees with input from Legal and Governance and Finance. Links have also recently been made through Tackling Poverty and Inequalities and to Community Council forums. Applications forms are available on the website <https://www.aberdeenshire.gov.uk/communities-and-events/funding>. This is split by Area so that it signposts applicants to the funds available in the appropriate area. Trustees are also encouraged to signpost constituents towards the trust as a source of funding where appropriate. Officers will also engage with Area Managers and Area Management Teams to alert them to funding to consider whether the funds could legitimately be used for community purposes without the need for an application from a body. If appropriate, a report will be taken to the relevant Area Committee to consider the proposal.
- 4.4 There is also a designated fund available for anyone in Aberdeenshire to access specifically for war wounded personnel. This funding is also available to organisations providing support for war wounded personnel in Aberdeenshire. The fund can be used for the relief of those war wounded personnel in need of relief for reason of age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage and the prevention or relief of poverty. Initial confidential discussions are ongoing with an organisation seeking information about accessing this fund. Given that this is a cross Aberdeenshire fund and not specific to an Area Committee, it is appropriate for the Business Services Committee, as the Committee responsible for Human Resources and Organisational Development as well as Finance, to determine any application relating to war wounded personnel. Any applications dealt with by the Business Services Committee will be included in the appropriate annual report.
