# 1. DECLARATION OF MEMBERS' INTERESTS

The Chair asked members if they had any interests to declare, in terms of the Councillors' Code of Conduct. No interests were declared.

### 2A. PUBLIC SECTOR EQUALITY DUTY

In taking decisions on the undernoted items of business, the Sub-Committee agreed, in terms of Section 149 of the Equality Act 2010:-

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# 4. CIVIC GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1982 – APPLICATIONS FOR DETERMINATION

## (a) Application for a Taxi Driver's Licence (Case No. 999)

There had been circulated a report dated 21 May, 2020, by the Director of Business Services, which (1) requested that consideration be given to an application for the grant of a taxi driver's licence (identified as Case No. 999) and (2) detailed information relevant to the application.

Having heard that an objection had been submitted by the Chief Constable of Police Scotland in which he had requested that, on the basis that justice could not otherwise be done, evidence of protected convictions required to be made available to members, the Sub-Committee **agreed** unanimously that the protected convictions should be taken into account.

Having heard from the applicant and the representative of the Chief Constable, the Sub-Committee **agreed** unanimously that the licence be granted for a period of one year.

## (b) Application for a Taxi Driver's Licence (Case No. 1000)

With reference to the Minute of Meeting of the Sub-Committee of 7 February, 2020 (Item 4(b)), when it had been agreed to defer consideration of an application for the grant of a taxi driver's licence (identified as Case No. 1000) to a future meeting to enable members to be advised of the outcome of pending criminal charges against the applicant, there was circulated a report dated 20 May, 2020, by the Director of Business Services, which (1) requested that consideration be given to the application, in respect of which the Chief Constable had made representations and (2) detailed information relevant to the application.

Thereafter, having heard from the applicant and the representative of the Chief Constable, members **agreed**, by a majority, to defer consideration of the application to the next meeting of the Sub-Committee, in order that further information regarding the pending criminal charges might be made available.

## (c) Application for a Taxi Driver's Licence (Case No. 1001)

There had been circulated a report dated 21 May, 2020, by the Director of Business Services, which (1) requested that consideration be given to an application for the grant of a taxi driver's licence (identified as Case No. 1001) and (2) detailed information relevant to the application.

Having heard from the applicant and the representative of the Chief Constable, the Sub-Committee **agreed** unanimously that the licence be granted for a period of three years.

## (d) Application for Renewal of a Taxi Driver's Licence (Case No. 1002)

There had been circulated a report dated 21 May, 2020, by the Director of Business Services, which (1) requested that consideration be given to an application for the

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renewal of a taxi driver's licence (identified as Case No. 1002), in respect of which the Chief Constable had made representations and (2) detailed information relevant to the application.

Having heard from the applicant and his representative, and the Chief Constable's representative, Councillor Forsyth, seconded by Councillor Robertson, moved that the licence be granted for a period of three years.

As an amendment, Councillor Stirling, seconded by Councillor Harper, moved that the licence be granted for a period of one year.
